Fort Drum, New York 28 MW Biomass Facility



Project Overview


Project Details

- The Defense Logistics Agency Energy, in close coordination with the Army Energy Initiatives Task Force (EITF), issued a Notice of Intent to Award in February 2014 to ReEnergy Holdings LLC for the purchase of up to 28 megawatts (MW) of electricity from a renewable energy biomass facility at Fort Drum, N.Y.
- The notice of intent to award at Fort Drum does not constitute a formal contract. However, it is a major milestone moving the project closer to a contract award that will take place after several remaining tasks are complete.
- Fort Drum will remain connected to the electrical grid, which will serve as a reliable and trusted source of power.
- The Fort Drum project will provide budget certainty, by ensuring a firm, fixed price for renewable electricity over the term of the contract, protecting against future escalation.
- ReEnergy owns and operates a former coal-fired power plant on Fort Drum and recently converted the plant to a biomass generation facility.
- This is the second EITF project to reach this milestone and one of eight EITF projects in the contracts and agreements phase.

Proposed Deal Structure

- 20 Year Power Purchase Agreement using 10 USC 2922(a) authority
- Satisfies Fort Drum's electricity requirements

- **Fort Drum is home to the 10th Mountain Division and is located in upstate New York.**
- **Fort Drum provides planning and support for the mobilization and training of almost 80,000 troops annually.**
- **Fort Drum's current average load is 20 MW; peak load is 28 MW.**
