


## Did You Know In MISSOURI

# DoD IN MISSOURI



## Kansas City District, Missouri Division

Established in 1907, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Kansas City District (KCD) is one of 44 districts in 9 Corps of Engineers divisions. Its missions include Civil Works, Military Construction, including planning, designing, building and operating water resources and other civil works projects such as flood control, levees (such as the Quindaro Levee), flood walls, drainage channels, disaster response, and Hazardous, Toxic and Radiation Wastes (HTRW) clean-up. KCD is the primary design district in 7 states and the secondary design district in 8 states for the HTRW cleanup program, and it is responsible for Naturally Occurring Radioactive Materials Disposal (non-fissionable materials) for the entire United States.



## 139th Airlift Wing

The 139th Airlift Wing, located at Rosecrans Memorial Airport, St. Joseph, MO, flies C-130H Hercules in support of world-wide missions as a reserve component of the Air Mobility Command. Their Advanced Airlift Tactics Training Center trains aircrew from all components of the Air Force, Marine Corps, and allied nations.



## Fort Leonard Wood

Fort Leonard Wood and the U.S. Army Maneuver Support Center (MANSCEN) is the home of the U.S. Army Engineer, Military Police and Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear Schools, the Third Basic Combat Training Brigade, the 4th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade, the DOD Humanitarian Demining Training Center, and Joint Training Detachments from the U.S. Marine Corps, Navy and Air Force. Fort Leonard Wood has become one of the Army's premier training centers, the only U.S. installation hosting three Army Schools and training facilities. The Chief of Staff of the Army has also designated Fort Leonard Wood as the Army's center of excellence for Homeland Defense. Cannon Range, contiguous to FLW, serves as an aerial gunnery range for all Air Force components.



## St. Louis District, Mississippi River Division

The St. Louis District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Mississippi Valley Division (MVD), is responsible for the navigation support and flood damage reduction on one of the largest inland waterway systems in the country. The St. Louis District encompasses 28,000 square miles and is almost equally divided between Missouri and Illinois. The district is an engineering and water resource agency dedicated to maintaining a proper and healthy balance of the varying uses of the heartland's waterways including river navigation including locks, dams, and river regulation as typified by the M. Price Locks and Dam; habitat Restoration; data collection including water control, photogrammetric mapping, geodesy, cartography, and Automated Performance Monitoring of Dams (APMD).

## Lake City Army Ammunition Plant

Located at Independence, Missouri, in Jackson County, is the largest small-arms (5.56 - 20 mm) manufacturing plant in the world. With the exception of the five year period between the end of World War II and the beginning of the Korean conflict, this facility has been in continuous production since October 1941. It encompasses 458 buildings on 3,935 acres.



## Whiteman Air Force Base

Whiteman is located near Knob Noster, Mo, in Johnson County, 65 miles southeast of Kansas City. Whiteman is the only Air Force base in CONUS that is home to three Wings: the 509th Bomb Wing flying the B-2 bomber; the Air National Guard's 131st Bomb Wing, also flying the B-2; and the Air Force Reserve's 442nd Fighter Wing, flying A-10 Thunderbolt IIs. Whiteman is the only B-2 base in CONUS. The base is also home to the Army National Guard's 1-135th Attack Battalion, flying the AH-64 Apache; and the Navy Reserve's Maritime Expeditionary Security Division 13, which provides light, mobile, short-duration, point defense Anti-Terrorism Force Protection forces for USN ships and aircraft and other high value assets in locations where U.S. or host-nation security infrastructure is either inadequate or non-existent.



## US Reserves and Missouri National Guard

The Guard and Reserves organize, train, and equip citizen soldiers/airmen to ensure their rapid mobilization for duties within the state, nation and around the world. While Reserves augment active duty forces, the Guard is unique, serving the Governor or President in times of crises. The Guard and Reserves contribute from various facilities across the state.
