






## Did You Know In ALABAMA

## G.C. Marshall Space Flight Center

The Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville is one of NASA's largest and most diversified installations. The unique capabilities and expertise found at the flight center develop and operate the engines, vehicles, space systems and science payloads that NASA will use to conduct unprecedented missions of science and discovery throughout our solar system.



## Anniston Army Depot

Anniston Army Depot occupies over 25 square miles of land, with 15,246 acres of woodland and 10 acres of lakes and streams. The depot is a state-of-the-market maintenance facility with the highly-esteemed reputation as "The Tank Rebuild Center of the World." It is the only depot capable of performing maintenance on heavy-tracked combat vehicles and their components. Anniston opened a state-of-the-art 250,000 square foot Small Arms Overhaul facility in January 2012.



## Alabama Army National Guard Training Site

The Training Site enclave encompasses large areas of Fort McClellan and Pelham Range. Following the closure of Fort McClellan, the Guard established a full-time presence and took possession of firing ranges, classrooms, and billeting facilities. The 22,000-acre Pelham Range serves as a primary training site for small arms and maneuver training for many units within the Army National Guard. The Guard and Reserve organize, train, and equip citizen soldiers/trainees to ensure their rapid mobilization for duties within the state, nation and around the world. While all Reserve Components have a federal mission to augment active duty forces in times of crises, the Guard has the additional, unique mission of serving the Governor during state emergencies. Guard and Reserve units are stationed throughout the state.




## Redstone Arsenal

Redstone is a Federal Center of Excellence focused on supporting the Joint Warfighter. Its logistics services: space operations; missile defense, intelligence, and homeland defense; and research and development capabilities position it for future growth and make it unique within the DoD. Redstone encompasses 38,125 acres, 19 million square feet of building space and over 20,000 employees.



## Fort Rucker

Fort Rucker covers 64,500 acres in southeastern Alabama and is home to the Army Aviation Center of Excellence. The Center provides aviation maintenance, logistics and lead ship training in support of the total force and foreign nations to sustain joint and combined aviation operations. Fort Rucker supports 4,600 people in uniform, 2,640 civilian and contract employees, and 3,800 military family



## Maxwell-Gunter AFB

The Air University, headquartered at Maxwell-Gunter Air Force Base, is a major component of the Air Education and Training Command. The University offers air and space education for all branches of the U.S. Armed Forces, federal government civilians and international organizations. Maxwell AFB is also home to the U.S. Air Force's Center for Professional Military Education and the Officer Training School.
