


Did You Know NEVADA

Army/Air National Guard

Over 3300 strong and growing, the Nevada National Guard maintains trained and equipped forces as reserve components of the Army and Air Force and performs missions as directed by the state or Federal authorities. The Nevada National Guard is involved in a full spectrum of operations ranging from the war on terrorism, homeland defense, foreign partnerships, state security and natural disaster relief missions.



Fallon NAS

The Navy's premier tactical aviation training facility, Fallon NAS is home to the Naval Strike Air Warfare Center, which includes the Navy Fighter Weapons School (TOPGUN), the Carrier Airborne Early Warning Weapons School and the Navy Rotary Wing Weapons School. Currently NAS Fallon is the only Naval Facility where advanced integrated Carrier Air Wing strike training can take place, combining realistic flight training in electronic warfare, air-to-ground, air-to-air weapons delivery, special weapons delivery, and enemy evasion tactics.



Nellis Test and Training Range

Aircraft from Nellis operate on the Nevada Test and Training Range, which offers one of the largest expanses of airspace available for training by the Air Force. Nellis AFB conducts advanced combat training, performs operational test and evaluation, and develops tactics.



Hawthorne Army Depot

The largest ammunition storage depot in the country, The Hawthorne Army Depot is the premiere resource recovery and recycling center of conventional ammunition. It is largest industrial activity in the state of Nevada.



Creech Air Force Base

Playing a major role in the ongoing war on terrorism, Creech Air Force Base is home to the MQ-1 Predator unmanned aerial vehicle which flies daily in Afghanistan and Iraq. The base also holds the Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) Battlelab that works with the warfighter to identify problems that can be solved using innovative UAV solutions.



Nellis Air Force Base

"Home of the Fighter Pilot," Nellis Air Force Base holds the U.S. Air Force Warfare Center, the largest and most demanding advanced air warfare training mission in the world. Training is conducted in conjunction with air and ground units of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps and air forces from our allied nations.
