CG: Chain of command key to SHARP solutions

With the Army stepping up its efforts to combat sexual harassment, assault and violence within its ranks, Maneuver Center of Excellence Commanding General Maj. Gen. H. R. McMaster took time to share his views on how sexual offenses are affecting the Army and ways to prevent those offenses.

While the Army promotes the Sexual Harassment/Assault Response and Prevention program and has implemented new Department of Defense initiatives, McMaster said it is important to recognize that sexual harassment and assault is a

threat to combat readiness. "First of all, we have to recognize the standards that come with our profession are very high, so this type of behavior cannot be tolerated at all," he said. "That has a lot to do with what we expect of each other as Soldiers, what is expected of us by society, and meeting those expectations. We know we are not going to tolerate this. We are going to fix this because it is inconsistent

The key to protecting Soldiers, he said, is making sure that leaders communicate

with their Soldiers and help them to understand that under no circumstances is sexual harassment and assault acceptable. In short, the general emphasized that the entire chain of command will focus on

Training helps Soldier save civilian driver

With years of training and a quick response, a Fort Benning Soldier came to the aid of a civilian driver during a routine commute last week.

Capt. Matthew Potts, commander for Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 192nd Infantry Brigade, said he was just fulfilling his duties as a Soldier.

"We're trained and we have a code of ethics that we live by," he said. "When the time comes to respond to a life-threatening situation to help others, the Soldier will act. It's just what we do."

Potts said he was driving home along Interstate 185 in Columbus after physical training on July 9 when he noticed a car erratically moving northbound in the median and grinding against the concrete barriers along the median.


"I saw cars scooting around it and I knew something was wrong, so I drove up to the side and I looked in and all of the airbags were deployed," Potts said. "When I looked inside I couldn't see a person sitting upright in the driver's seat and no hands on the steering wheel."

Potts said he knew the driver was in immediate danger and with a few seconds to respond, his 20 years of military police evasive driving training immediately kicked in.

"All of your senses come alive during those times as described in by the German

Reductions-in-force, halt to modernization possible

WASHINGTON — If sequestration continues into fiscal 2014, the Defense Department will be forced to consider involuntary reductions-in-force for the civilian workforce, draconian cuts to military personnel accounts and a virtual halt to military modernization, Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel said in a letter to Senate leaders July 10.

The senators had requested detailed

information on how continued sequestration could affect the military.

In the letter, Hagel detailed the "Plan B" the department must confront if Congress does not pass legislation that averts sequestration in fiscal 2014. If the process continues, DOD will be forced to cut \$52 billion more from the budget that year.

Hagel stressed in the letter that he fully supports President Barack Obama's fiscal 2014 budget request and noted that if sequestration remains in effect, "the size, readiness and technological superiority of

our military will be reduced, placing at much greater risk the country's ability to meet our current national security commitments."

Congress gave DOD some flexibility to handle the cuts needed for fiscal 2013, but more than 650,000 DOD civilians must still be furloughed without pay for 11 days. However, the cuts in 2014 are too great even for flexibility within accounts to handle.

DOD hopes to avoid furloughs in 2014, the defense secretary said, but if sequestration remains in effect, "DOD will

TRADOC leads MOS, gender integration review

FORT EUSTIS, Va. — As U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command continues to design the force of the future, it will also review the standards for all Soldiers — men and women alike — to support the future force.

Training and Doctrine Command, known as TRADOC, is currently leading two efforts, part of what is collectively called "Soldier 2020." The first examines

the physical demands of specific military occupational specialties, starting with those currently closed to women. The second studies the cultural and institutional effects of integrating women into those previously closed occupations and units.

The first effort, with support from the U.S. Army Medical Command's U.S. Army Research Institute of Environmental Medicine, or USARIEM, is a three-year review of the physical standards required for

**First female
Soldiers become
artillery mechanics**

FORT LEE, Va. — The Army Artillery Mechanic is no longer a male-only military occupational specialty.

Two Soldiers — Pfc. Jessica Jones and Pfc. Angelika Jansen — are the first females to hold the military occupational specialty, or MOS. They graduated from the U.S. Army Ordnance School Tuesday.

The 15-week course they attended, also known as MOS 91P, is one of six the Army opened to women last year as part of an effort to loosen the combat exclusion provisions under the Direct Ground Combat Definition and Assignment Rule.

As artillery mechanics, the two active-duty Soldiers will perform maintenance and recovery on self-propelled cannons such as the M109A6 Paladin, a weapons system that can be located on the frontlines of a combat theater.

Jones, the daughter of an Air Force retiree, downplayed her ground-breaking achievement.

“I just look at it as something else under my belt,” said the 24-year-old. “I didn’t try to make this a big deal because I didn’t want to put myself on a high pedestal. It’s just another challenge I’ve faced, something I’ve done that I never thought I could have.”

Jansen, a native of Garland, Texas, seemed more excited about her “first.”

“This is a step forward for women,” said the 23-year-old daughter of an Army veteran. “I find it pretty awesome. But at the same time, I’m ready to move past the honeymoon stage and get into my work; get the show rolling.”

**Garbage in,
compost out**

FORT CARSON, Colo. — Reaching the goal of net zero waste at Fort Carson is getting a boost through a waste service contract that began in May, which includes the task of collecting compostable waste at several dining facilities and the commissary.

Six Nations, the new recycle and refuse contractor, subcontracts with local company Bestway Disposal for collection of the food waste left on plates at the dining facilities. The commissary will begin composting spoiled food within the next several weeks when it receives a large-scale compactor.

“Organic waste typically is the second largest percentage of municipal waste behind paper products,” said Eric Bailey, recycle program manager, Operations and Maintenance Division, Directorate of Public Works. “Having large generators of that material on post, we believe it’s an easy approach to putting another major dent in landfill-bound materials.”

Bailey estimates that through the compost collection effort, up to 1,200 tons of food waste will be collected and diverted from going to the landfill yearly.

Many items are compostable, to include such things as fruit and vegetable peels, meat, tea bags, coffee grounds, bread, egg shells and various paper products.

At its end state, the waste becomes beneficial again, becoming compost through natural decomposition of the material with other wastes (such as bio-solids, gypsum, wood, yard wastes, etc.). Once the compost process is complete, it can be used as natural fertilizer that is rich in nutrients, Bailey said.

Army to link online training to NCO advancement

WASHINGTON — The Army will soon require NCOs to complete online training prior to promotion eligibility. Additionally, NCO schools will no longer be waived.

Beginning Jan. 1, the Army will formally link completion of Structured Self Development, or SSD training, with professional military education courses for promotion eligibility.

The changes are outlined in Army Directive 2013-15, dated July 1.

Gerald Purcell, Army personnel policy integrator for NCO Professional Development, G-1, said the goal is to shape a new career timeline for NCOs that includes all the tenets of leader development, including education, training and experiences.

“Over the last 10 years, we were really an Army out of balance in terms of those three tenets of developing leaders,” Purcell said. “The accumulation of experiences alone does not equate to a fully developed leader.”

The change is part of an initiative to select, train and promote Soldiers who are best qualified in their current grade, and who show the greatest potential to serve in positions of increased responsibility, Purcell said.

“Our NCOs are charged with the training and care of our Soldiers while enforcing standards, so it is imperative we equip them with the best tools we can to help them do their job,” said Sgt. Maj. of the Army Raymond F. Chandler III. “Connecting the NCO Education System and promotions

in a deliberate, continuous, sequential and progressive manner produces the best NCO Corps possible. It gives us the competent and committed leaders of character our Army needs and deserves.”

The effort, Purcell said, will foster a balance of training, education and experience, while encouraging life-long learning and development of broadly skilled NCOs. Another important aspect is to sustain an all-volunteer force by providing viable career paths.

He said that while the Army is an efficient organization that is effective operationally, the other aspects of leader development must not be overlooked.

“We’ve really paid the price because while operational experience is great, it in and of itself doesn’t make great leaders because you still need the education and the training to round it all out,” Purcell said.

NCOs had been allowed to serve 30 years, and then would have to retire. Purcell said the NCO timeline was extended to 32 years to allow for the completion of those three tenets and to foster the development of the world’s most professional NCO Corps. This timeline facilitates an environment where Army professionals can meet the Army’s certification criteria of competence, character and commitment.

The Army is an “up or out” organization, Purcell said. The policies support a fundamental baseline by which professionals remain technically and tactically proficient with continued opportunities for development and advancement.

The directive says Soldiers should be

considered for promotion when they achieve competency in their current rank and exhibit the potential to serve successfully at the next higher rank, which entails an increased level of responsibility.

The areas Soldiers must excel in to advance include professional competence, team building, adaptability, lifelong learning, and comprehensive fitness.


Some of the requirements for advancement include:

- Specialists and corporals must complete SSD-1 before they can be recommended (boarded) to sergeant.
- Sergeants must complete the Warrior Leader Course before they can be recommended (boarded) to staff sergeant.
- Staff sergeants must complete SSD-3 before they are eligible for consideration for sergeant first class.
- Sergeants first class must complete SSD-4 before they are eligible for consideration for master sergeant.

The directive states waivers for the Warrior Leader Course, known as WLC, will no longer allow sergeants to be considered for promotion.

Soldiers who had been previously granted WLC waivers must graduate from the course no later than Sept. 30, 2014. Soldiers who are deployed when the changes go into effect, Jan. 1, will have up to 270 days after redeployment to complete the course. Reserve-component Soldiers will have up to 270 days after release from active duty to complete the WLC.

The directive says Soldiers who do not complete the required WLC training will be removed from the promotion list for staff sergeant or reduced to sergeant.

Army Reserve ambassador visits Benning

When a neighbor became the victim of the 9/11 terrorist attacks, it ignited a passion within Boston-based sportscaster Ted Sarandis.

The neighbor's name was Kathleen Nicosia, Sarandis said, and that event sparked his ambition to promote the American Soldier.

"I felt a personal sense of violation," Sarandis said.

Sarandis, who serves as the U.S. Army Reserve ambassador for the state of Massachusetts, paid a visit to Fort Benning July 7-10 and got a little taste of everything the Maneuver Center of Excellence has to offer — from observing Infantry Soldiers conducting advanced rifle marksmanship to a tour of the facilities on Harmony Church. He was here on the invitation of Maj. Gen. H. R. McMaster, Fort Benning's commanding general, he said.

"I came to Fort Benning for my summer vacation," Sarandis said. "I'm down here on my own initiative and my own dollar."

"My No. 1 mission for the trip is to be able to tell the American people about the phenomenal things our Soldiers are doing."

Sarandis was appointed the Army Reserve's ambassador in 2006 by its chief of staff, Lt. Gen. Jack C. Stultz, and has since devoted much of his free time to raising Army awareness and advocating for military personnel and their families.

Currently a freelance sportscaster, Sarandis was the voice of the Boston College basketball for 15 seasons and hosted his own sports radio show for Boston-based stations WEEI and 98.5 The Sports Hub. Aside from discussing Boston sports, Sarandis has used his radio influence to form a bridge between the military and the people of

Massachusetts.

"I want to encourage more civilians to get more involved," Sarandis said. "I think every day, 'What else can I do to raise awareness for the Army?'"

"It's really a challenge in Northeast states that have a very small active-duty footprint to tell people about the remarkable things that are being done in the United States Army."

As a voice of Boston sports, the terrorist attacks at the Boston Marathon on April 15 hit even closer to home with Sarandis, who was attending the Patriots' Day Parade in Lexington, Mass., at the time. As ambassador, Sarandis said an event like that can highlight the importance of the Army Reserve.

"The last initiative Lt. Gen. Stultz put forward at the strategic level was he went

through Gen. Odierno and briefed congress about the ability to get the Army Reserve integrated into the Defense Support of Civil Authorities," Sarandis said. "Lt. Gen. Stultz lives in Florida and he said after all the hurricanes, 'We have all these Army Reserve units in Florida. Why do we have to wait to get help from the 82nd Airborne? Why not have Army Reserve medical and logistic units in Florida?' They should be able to respond to a civil emergency immediately, rather than waiting to get an active-duty unit involved through all the procedures."

"Now legislation has passed (National Defense Authorization Act, December 2011) so that Army Reserve units in all 50 states can respond immediately to support the National Guard and the governors in a civil emergency. There were some

Army Reserve units who volunteered to get involved in the April 15 attack. I don't believe they were formally called up, but they were prepared to do so. And we did have a number of Army Reserve doctors ... working in hospitals in Boston and treating the victims of the Boston Marathon attack."

Sarandis said 12 of those Reserve Soldiers have since been awarded an Army Commendation Medal for their heroics on April 15.

During his visit to Fort Benning, Sarandis also visited the 98th Division Initial Entry Training, an Army Reserve Unit that trains drill sergeants, the Warrior Transition Battalion and the Ranger Training Brigade. The most memorable Soldier Sarandis met was Sgt. 1st Class Michael Ferguson, an instructor with RTB, he said.

Sarandis said he was inspired by Ferguson's story of balancing his duties of being a Soldier with earning a bachelor's degree (now going for a master's at San Diego State), sometimes getting only one or two hours of sleep per night.

"He's one of the most remarkable and outstanding Soldiers I've ever met," Sarandis said. "He epitomizes the Army values."

Sarandis also visited the 75th Ranger Regiment and made two jumps from a 34-foot tower at the Airborne School.

"I was proud to perform two jumps from the 34-foot tower at Airborne School," he said. "The cadre agreed that at age 57, I was the oldest to jump that they could remember."

Sarandis said one of the biggest takeaways from his visit was seeing the combined arms effort of the MCoE firsthand.

"It was a brilliant concept to bring all these elements together and train the exact same way that we fight," he said. "That is huge."

Marine Corps Detachment changes leadership

Federal agency leaders discuss environmental stewardship

Executives from federal agencies with natural resources missions visited Fort Benning to discuss best practices in environmental management and stewardship in the Southeast.

The agencies represented included the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Environmental Protection Agency, U.S. Forest Service, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, National Park Service, Federal Emergency Management Agency, Federal Highway Administration and Natural Resource Conservation Service.

The installation was chosen for the Southeast Natural Resources Leaders Group principals' meeting June 11-12 because of the installation's environmental stewardship, said Susan Gibson, director of U.S. Army Regional Environmental Office-Southern.

"(The installation's) environmental and natural resource management reflects the hard work of many dedicated people in the Army staff and our partnering organizations," she said. "Their efforts make Fort Benning a great example of

how to successfully balance mission, the environment and community."

SENRLG members, including the REEO-S, are committed to the common purpose of fulfilling agency mandates in ways that promote conservation and restoration of natural resources, and ecologically sustainable development, she said.

Topics covered include:

- Fort Benning's use of prescribed fire as a

forest management tool that sustains military training areas, while supporting endangered species and other wildlife requirements.

- In-stream flows and the challenges of balancing the needs and competition for limited freshwater.

- The Chattahoochee Fall Line Conservation Partnership, which illustrates the necessity and successes of collaboration.

- The Army Compatible Use Buffer Program

- Fort Benning's cultural resource management program, which illustrated the commitments to preserving and conserving historic sites, as well as Tribal and installation consultation.

"Fort Benning has a long track record of protecting the environment, conserving its natural resources and supporting military training," said John Brent, the Directorate of Public Work's Environmental Management Division chief. "We have found that sustaining both military readiness and natural resources allows us to effectively advance the interests of both."

While on post, the group operated the simulators used by Soldiers in training,

toured the National Infantry Museum and visited Kings Pond, where natural resources specialists and wildlife biologists discussed the installation's recovery population of red-cockaded woodpeckers, a listed endangered species, and one of only 13 such populations in the Southeast.

Many other rare species such as the gopher tortoise, gopher frog, southern hognose snake, sweet and parrot pitcher plants, and relict trillium can be found on Fort Benning. Various protected areas are designed to restore and conserve their ecosystems and enhance species recovery, explained Pete Swiderek, Conservation Branch manager. Such safeguarding efforts also ensure continued protection of critical military operations.

Gibson said introducing the SENRLG principals to Fort Benning left them with a lasting impression.

"They saw that the civilians and Soldiers who work and train at the installation not only maintain the military missions critical to our national security, but also are outstanding stewards of the land and environment."

Army civilians begin first week of furlough

WASHINGTON — Some 229,000 Army civilians began their furloughs this week, along with thousands of other military civilians.

Using Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel's guidance, the Army distributed each person's 88 hours of furlough this fiscal year for one day a week for a total of 11 days, from this week through September, said Tony J. Stamilio, deputy assistant secretary of the Army for Manpower and Reserve Affairs, Civilian Personnel and Quality of Life.

Commanders were given a lot of flexibility in choosing the day of the week employees would be furloughed, Stamilio said, adding that it boiled down to mission requirements and accommodation of employee considerations.

DIGNITY AND RESPECT

The furloughs are undoubtedly having a negative impact on morale, said Stamilio.

"No one wanted this to happen," he said. "It is difficult for all of us."

Stamilio said he wants to try to soften the blows.

It's important managers encourage good communications throughout the work force and that everyone is treated with dignity and respect. He said he's already seeing some of this with one-on-ones with supervisors, sensing sessions and town hall meetings.

The Army and DOD are also gauging morale and attitudes with surveys. Current surveys combined with those from previous years, he said, will show longitudinal trends and impacts.

One of the first steps the Army took when it learned that the furlough would definitely take place was to ensure to the maximum extent possible that those furlough notices be hand-delivered by first-line supervisors, Stamilio said. The reason was so that there could be an opportunity for conversations where thoughts and feelings could be expressed.

Over the last decade of wartime service, Army civilians have performed as

magnificently as their military counterparts, Stamilio concluded.

"Thousands have deployed in harm's way and others have performed essential support service on the home-front," he said. "I want to take a moment to recognize their great service and I want each and every one of them to realize that the furloughs are in no way a negative reflection of their valuable contributions."

Stamilio said he encourages managers to pass that same message on to their own employees.

NO GOOD OPTION

The Army and the other services had no other good option but to furlough civilian workers, said Hagel, who directed the furlough.

"Major budgetary shortfalls drove the basic furlough decision," Hagel wrote in a May 14, 2013 memo to service chiefs. "DOD's budget for fiscal year 2013 was reduced by \$37 billion, including \$20 billion in the operations and maintenance accounts that pay many of our civilian workers."

Stamilio thinks this year's furloughs will save the Army about \$500 million.

Although the furlough will result in cost savings, reductions in services are inevitable.

The Army is experiencing a 20 percent staffing reduction as a result of the furlough, which means some tasks or missions are being reduced or simply not getting done at all, Stamilio acknowledged.

As a result of the man-hour losses, managers and supervisors "have been instructed to prioritize the most critical tasks and mission pieces," he said.

Since this is the first time that DOD and the Army have gone through this type of furlough, "we are still working out the bugs to ensure mission-critical duties are getting done," Stamilio said.

Working out those bugs involves weekly conversations across all Army commands with leaders and human resource managers, he said. Some of those meetings are formal and some are informal.

Besides meeting with Army leaders, Stamilio said he's in contact with outside

agencies as well, including a meeting he had this week with all the national labor partners the Army deals with.

"We've got to hear their concerns and suggestions on ways to make things run more smoothly," he said.

Rules for the furlough will remain in place as directed by Hagel, but implementation "will evolve somewhat on the margins as we figure out better and smarter ways to do things and as we get supplementary guidance from the Office of the Secretary of Defense," Stamilio said.

SOME EXEMPTIONS

Most but not all Army civilians are being furloughed.

Exemptions include employees paid from non-appropriated funds. Since they don't receive paychecks from the Army, no savings would result, Stamilio explained.

Also exempted are some Army civilians involved in health and safety occupations such as police officers, firefighters or emergency-room technicians, he said.

A third category involves those serving in combat zones or in areas deemed critical to national security, such as key intelligence positions.

"Our goal in making these decisions was participation to the maximum extent possible," he said, meaning to make the process fair as well as to maximize cost savings.

To add to cost savings and to prevent more furlough days, the Army instituted an across-the-board hiring freeze this year, except for positions supervisors or commanders deem "critical" to the Army mission, Stamilio said.

Some in uniform are feeling the impact of the furlough as well.

Reservists who are also DOD employees are also being furloughed, although their normal military duties and paychecks are not impacted.

National Guard Soldiers who are not in a mobilization status are also being furloughed since they are considered "dual-status" employees, getting paid in the same manner as civilian employees when they are not mobilized.

protecting victims, investigating and prosecuting perpetrators, nurturing a positive command climate, and hold individuals — and each other — accountable.

"Just like any other problem we face in our Army in combat or in peacetime training, we're going to solve it with the chain of command, and I have tremendous confidence in our leaders at every level," he said.

"It's a comprehensive effort across all of Fort Benning, but the main thing is the chain of command must be active every day. It's going to be sergeants leading Soldiers that really makes the difference in this effort."

Sexual harassment and assault within the ranks can chip away at the foundation of trust that must be built in order for the Army to maintain its combat effectiveness, something McMaster said must not happen.

"Our Army is a team, where Soldiers are bound together by mutual trust and respect," he said.

"They're in units where the person next to you is willing to give anything, including their own life, for you. Anything that violates that trust or violates that respect is a grave threat to our combat readiness. It's the kind of behavior that Soldiers can't tolerate from each other, and leaders have to make sure that Soldiers understand that any sort of behavior that can lead to sexual harassment or sexual assault cannot be tolerated."

And while commanders must be vigilant in looking for opportunities to prevent sexual offenses, ultimately all throughout the Army's ranks and civilian workforce must share the burden.

"Everybody is responsible for intervening in any instance of sexual assault or sexual harassment," McMaster said.

"Leaders at all levels, as well as Soldiers at all levels, have to correct any of that behavior that they see or experience anywhere at Fort Benning."

Despite the challenges the Army faces, progress is being made.

Army surveys show that between 2009 and 2012, female Soldiers' "propensity to report" having been the victim of sexual assault has increased from 28 percent to 42 percent. McMaster said that willingness to report must continue to grow, and each reported instance must be treated seriously.

"We encourage any victims to come forward and report," he said.

A variety of programs and individuals are available across Fort Benning to aid and protect victims of sexual harassment or sexual assault.

Each unit has a full-time sexual assault response coordinator at the brigade level and a part-time SARC at the battalion level.

Each unit and battalion also has a victims' advocate, who will work with and assist any victim who comes forward, as well.

In addition, Fort Benning has an installation SHARP team that consists of an installation SARC and VA. Victims or concerned parties may also call the Fort Benning sexual assault hotline at 706-566-7393.

word '*fingerspitzengefühl*' and the handling of a complex situation you go into this cognitive zone between you as a thinking entity and how you act where training takes over," he said. "(Military police) officers are highly trained to execute both defensive and offensive moves in response to isolating a vehicle threat."

Potts said he drove ahead of the car, which was accelerating approximately 10 to 15 miles per hour, and used his vehicle to stop the car.

"I made the decision to use my vehicle as a barrier, (like) combat training scenarios," Potts said. "We're trained to push a disabled vehicle out of the kill zone, but in this case it was the reverse of that. I made contact, applied a threshold braking technique and brought the vehicle to a halt."

After stopping the car, Potts was able to assist the driver, a 25-year-old male,

who was unconscious. With the help of two other drivers, Columbus police and EMS personnel were contacted and arrived several minutes later to transport the driver to a local hospital.

Potts said even without professional training, all drivers should remain aware of their surroundings on the highway and confidently assist others when help is needed.

"I would recommend to everyone to be cognizant of your surroundings," he said. "If you see a situation, react to it, trust your abilities and it will go well."

have to consider involuntary reductions-in-force to reduce civilian personnel costs."

Readiness has already been diminished this year, Hagel said, and it will continue to decline if sequestration continues in 2014. Hiring freezes will also continue and facilities maintenance funds will further erode,

he added.

If the sequestration mechanism is applied to military personnel funding, "DOD could accommodate the required reductions only by putting into place an extremely severe package of military personnel actions including halting all accessions, ending all permanent-change-of-station moves, stopping discretionary bonuses and freezing all promotions," Hagel wrote.

He called on Congress to work with the department to avoid sequestration in fiscal 2014 and to approve the

president's defense budget request.

The president's budget request slows military pay raises and raises fees for some military retiree's health care. It also looks to retire older Air Force and Navy assets and calls for a new base realignment and closure program.

"If the cuts continue, the department will have to make sharp cuts with far-reaching consequences, including limiting combat power, reducing readiness and undermining the national security interests of the United States," Hagel said.

MOSs across the Army — regardless of gender.

“Not only are these gender-neutral standards, but they’re also age-neutral and body-type neutral standards,” said Edward Zambraski, chief of USARIEM’s Military Performance Division. “In other words, it’s purely physical.”

Currently in the first phase of the gender-neutral physical standards review, TRADOC will begin by verifying the required tasks for each MOS, starting with branches with closed occupations: the Engineer, Field Artillery, Armor and Infantry branches.

Researchers from USARIEM will then use these task lists to determine the physical demands required to perform each task successfully.

Marilyn Sharp, USARIEM’s lead investigator for the project, said once researchers analyze the physical demands required for a specific task, they will develop a task simulation, or a mock-up, of the real task to measure the effort required to perform the task successfully.

“Let’s say it’s a task that involved lifting a certain structure a certain distance and placing it someplace,” Zambraski said. “We would do the mock-up in our laboratories and take measurements on the subjects to see — how much strength are they using to do this, how much endurance are they using to do this, how long does it take them to do this — then we can quantify the task.”

The end goal, Zambraski said, is a set of predictive tests — whether it may be strength, endurance, fine-motor skills or a combination of several tests — to determine the right match for the right MOS.

“The idea would be to have a series of tests — relatively simple tests — that could be applied early on in a Soldiers’ career — perhaps at the beginning or end of basic training — that would give information as to whether or not the Soldier would be physically capable of performing in that MOS,” Zambraski said.

Tom DeFilippo, TRADOC G-3/5/7 senior plans analyst, likened the concept of the predictive tests to a sort of physical version of the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery, better known as the ASVAB, which would benefit Soldiers, their units and the Army overall.

“Having a more defined requirement —

not just mental, but physical — will lead to less attrition, lower injury rates and better performance of our Soldiers, which allows them to be more successful when they get to a unit, thereby making the unit more successful,” DeFilippo said.

Gen. Robert W. Cone, TRADOC’s commanding general, also took some time to discuss the command’s efforts regarding standards, success, and TRADOC’s efforts in Soldier 2020 during a recent professional development forum.

“I go up and talk to units all the time. I was talking to the 1st Cavalry Division, 101st Airborne Division and 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment, and Soldiers are OK with this — as long as we maintain standards,” Cone said.

Cone said through a standards-based approach, success will not be defined by numbers, such as having 5 or 10 percent of women in Infantry, but rather it will be defined as the opportunity for women to be able to serve. He cited some of the recently opened MOSs, including Bradley mechanic and Multiple Launch Rocket System, or MLRS, crewmember, where Pvt. Alexandra Seccareccio recently set the standard for all Soldiers.

“We had our first woman graduate from (MLRS) school with a 100 percent score — in

everything,” Cone said. “And now, the key is getting them to the right units.”

Unit success also depends on a number of additional factors, many of which are currently being examined through a gender integration study led by the TRADOC

Analysis Center, or TRAC, in the second effort supporting Soldier 2020.

TRAC’s study, with support from the Army Research Institute, began in January and will use interviews, focus groups and surveys with leaders and Soldiers to look at the cultural effects of implementing full gender integration.

“We want to hear from the ground up, from the top down and from the middle,” said Peter Kerekanich, deputy director for TRAC’s gender integration study.

The study will analyze cultural factors — expectations, customs and social behaviors of the Army associated with integration — as well as institutional factors, which include Army processes and policies that may be affected or changed because of integration.

Most important, Kerekanich added, is the Soldiers’ perspective — listening to and capturing the challenges they identify and polling them to identify possible solutions to potential Army challenges.

TRAC’s study team has already planned initial visits to the Engineer, Field Artillery, Infantry and Armor schools as well as engaging a wide breadth of additional institutions throughout the Army, including Intermediate Level Education, Pre-Command Course and the U.S. Army Sergeants Major Academy. The team is also working toward visiting National Guard and U.S. Army Forces Command units.

In addition to numerous site visits to gather information from the force, TRAC has also reached out to academia, monitored sister service progress and will continue to review other published material on gender integration throughout the study, which is scheduled to end March 2015.

“This is a complex issue,” Kerekanich said. “It will require the study team and the Army to go beyond just the service and incorporate findings and data from external sources.”

As TRAC continues to gather data from a variety of sources, the team will identify positive, neutral and negative factors, Kerekanich said; however, the end goal is to proactively identify the problems — and solutions — before integration begins.

Cone said TRADOC’s efforts are off to a good start; however, the studies will take time in order to be successful, and ultimately, improve standards throughout the Army.

“As the TRADOC commander, I can’t lower organizational performance — our hard-earned reputation is combat-ready formations,” Cone said. “We can make this a better Army by uniformly imposing these valid standards across the board.”

SGT MAJ MATTHEW J BERRENA



Berrena entered the service in June 1979 and spent the majority of his 26-year military career serving in Ranger units. He participated in four combat actions: Operation Urgent Fury in Grenada, Operation Just Cause in Panama, Operation Desert Storm in Iraq and Operation Iris Gold in Kuwait.

MASTER SGT THOMAS BRAGG



Bragg began his Ranger career in 1960 by saving a classmate's life when the classmate slid over a cliff at Mt. Yonah, Ga. Bragg demonstrated hand-to-hand fighting and rappelling techniques for President John F. Kennedy. He also helped build the original Camp Darby and was the camp's first NCOIC.

LT COL JAMES F DABNEY



Dabney is a recipient of the Distinguished Service Cross for extraordinary heroism while serving in Quan Binh Chanh Province, Vietnam, May 6-10, 1968. Dabney led D Company, 4th Battalion, 12th Infantry, 199th Light Infantry Brigade, during the four-day battle that eventually led to D Company being awarded the Presidential Unit Citation.

COMMAND SGT MAJ ROBERT GILBERT



Gilbert began his career as a Ranger in 1958. He served two tours in the Korean War and served as a senior Cavalry scout advisor to two South Vietnamese cavalry squadrons in Vietnam's Mekong Delta. Gilbert also served three tours at the Army Ranger School as a senior instructor, chief instructor and the command sergeant major.

COMMAND SGT MAJ DOUG GREENWAY



Greenway served 28 years, during which he filled every leadership position from corporal to command sergeant major in the 75th Ranger Regiment. He participated in Operation Just Cause in Panama. Before retiring in August 2007, he completed the 2007 Best Ranger Competition, becoming the oldest competitor to finish.

SGT MAJ PATRICK HURLEY



Hurley died in a helicopter crash in Saudi Arabia while participating in Operation Desert Storm. During his 18-year career, Hurley was awarded the Bronze Star, two Army Commendation Medals, and the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal with stars for participation in Grenada and Panama.

COMMAND SGT MAJ JOSEPH MATTISON



Mattison participated in Operation Just Cause in Panama, when he served as a first sergeant with A Company, 3rd Ranger Battalion. He made a combat jump into Rio Hata, PDF Military Base, and later had three significant follow-on combat air assault missions.

COMMAND SGT MAJ ANDREW MCFOWLER



During 35 years of active-duty service, McFowler served two tours in Vietnam and in Panama. McFowler went on to serve as command sergeant major of U.S. Army Forces Command, Atlanta. He earned numerous awards, including a Bronze Star and Purple Heart before retiring in February 2002.

SGT 1ST CLASS VINCENT MELILLO



Melillo participated in combat actions with the 5307th Composite Unit Provisional, later known as Merrill's Marauders, during World War II and with the 5th Regimental Combat Team during the Korean War. For his actions during World War II, Melillo was awarded two Bronze Stars. He was discharged due to disability in August 1945, but waived his disability to re-enlist in 1949.

MASTER SGT HOWARD MULLEN



Mullen conducted a 500-foot combat parachute assault on the island of Grenada during Operation Urgent Fury. He also served as a senior Ranger instructor and head combative instructor with 3rd Ranger Company, "Morgan Team" Committee Group, from 1985-87 and with C Company, 4th Ranger Training Battalion, from 1987-91.

GEN PETER J SCHOOMAKER



Schoomaker served in the Army for 44 years, eventually serving as Chief of Staff of the Army. During his career, Schoomaker participated in Operation Eagle Claw in Iran, Operation Urgent Fury in Grenada, Operation Just Cause in Panama, Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm in Southwest Asia, Operation Uphold Democracy in Haiti and multiple covert missions.

COMMAND SGT MAJ WILLIAM SMITH



Smith was awarded the Silver Star and Purple Heart after he was wounded in battle Feb. 1, 1967, while serving in Vietnam. While leading a patrol along the Dong Nai River, the point man was shot in the chest. Smith returned fire and plunged ahead to save his comrade. Smith took fire from multiple positions, resulting in three of his fingers being severed by enemy fire.

LT COL FREDERICK SPAULDING



Spaulding served in three combat areas: the Dominican Republic, Korea and Vietnam. He commanded five rifle companies, was selected for United Nations Honor Guard duty at Eighth Army Headquarters and was NCO of the Year in 1963 for 1st Cavalry Division. He has been awarded the Silver Star, Distinguished Flying Cross and other medals.

LT GEN GARY D SPEER



Speer was one of the original members of the 1st Ranger Battalion. During that time, he was involved in the writing and documentation of the training objectives for every individual and collective task, a process that provided the basis for what the Army ultimately developed as Soldier's Manuals and ARTEPs. He later commanded the 2nd Ranger Battalion.

MAJ CARLETON P VENCILL



Vencill served three tours in Vietnam, during which time he led a rifle platoon, pioneered long reconnaissance operations with the 173rd Airborne Brigade's Long Range Reconnaissance Platoon, commanded a rifle company and led a "Hatchet Force" company made up of American officers, Montagnards and Chinese Nungs.

COMMAND SGT MAJ CHARLES P WILLIAMS



Williams was awarded the Bronze Star with three Oak Leaf Clusters for his actions during his two tours in Vietnam. Williams' 27-year career of active-duty service ended with his assignment as the command sergeant major of the U.S. Military Academy in West Point, N.Y.

Town hall to address DoDEA furloughs

So you want to know more about how the Department of Defense Education Activity will affect the schools? The perfect opportunity is during the Facebook Town Hall.

Parents and those affected by school furloughs can ask questions and get answers during the upcoming Facebook Town Hall, planned from 6 to 7:30 p.m. July 31 on the Fort Benning Fans Facebook page at www.facebook.com/fortbenningfans.

The focus is on school issues, but experts will be on hand to discuss other issues including housing and safety, said Fordyce Stone, education operations manager for the Georgia and Alabama district.

Fort Benning schools will be closed due to furloughs on Aug. 23, Aug. 30, Sept. 13 and Sept. 26-27.

Nine-month employees with the Department of Defense Education Activity will be furloughed for five days, he said. They are part of more than 84,000 employees who will be affected by furloughs.

"We want to make sure that parents are aware of those five days," Stone said.

Several organizations on post have plans in place to help support parents during these times, he said. Information will be released to those interested on handling day care issues with school-aged children.

"If you have children who will need day care that normally wouldn't ... you need to check with the different facilities on post," Stone said, adding information on

day care alternatives will be available during the Facebook town hall.

Stone said teachers and staff will modify programs to accommodate furlough dates without affecting children's curriculum or tests.

"Our teachers are very professional," he said. "They are very good with instruction — they love their children. They do a good job. They are going to handle these five days."

New, larger hospital to be completed fall 2014

The new Hospital, located along the banks of Upatoi Creek, will open in fall of 2014. Soldiers, Family members and retirees of the Fort Benning community will receive care in the 745,000 square-foot facility. The additional space will provide a more comfortable setting for patients and staff, as well as offer additional services and be twice the size of the current hospital, designers said.

The current hospital originally opened

in 1958 as a 250-bed inpatient hospital. Today, it is one of the Army's oldest active hospitals.

"The existing MACH has been a community landmark for more than 50 years," said Col. Timothy Lamb, former commander of the hospital. "Generations of beneficiaries throughout the region received top-notch medical care here. Memories and emotions are strong for the old facility but it has outlived its lifespan. The new hospital is designed to meet today's medical needs, while being scalable and adaptable for tomorrow's

medical advancements."

Enhanced capabilities include two MRI suites and 10 pharmacy windows. The hospital will have six acuity adaptable intensive care units, 24 medical surgical beds expandable to double occupancy for surge capacity, 14 postpartum beds and a 24-bed inpatient behavioral health ward. The emergency department will also receive enhancements to reduce wait times and to better treat heat-related injuries.

Patients and visitors will enter through the grand concourse. The building's

central focal point will separate the 70-bed inpatient area from the outpatient and wellness care facilities. Patients and staff benefit from the consolidation of the clinics and interdependent specialties, planners said.

"The grand concourse and adjoining multi-level atrium offers easy accessibility throughout the building, plus offers intuitive wayfinding," said David Fortune, the Southeast program manager for the Health Facility Planning Agency. "To help reduce patient foot traffic in the hospital,

Know your day care options on-post

If you are wondering about the best course of action for your children because you are furloughed or your child attends a school on post — the Child, Youth, & School Services program is offering day care that caters to parents' needs.

CYSS Director Jeannie Williams said parents have been inquiring about day care options regarding furlough days and how they will be able to get child care. But also, what to do if a parent takes a child out of day care on a furlough day.

For parents being furloughed, Williams said they will be offered a discounted rate if their children are currently enrolled in full-time day care.

"(They will receive a) temporary re-evaluation of the

•**McGraw Child Development Center:** Offers full-day care for ages 6 weeks to 5 years. Part day preschool is available for ages 3 and 4 year olds.

•**Indianhead Child Development Center:** Serves ages 6-weeks to 5 years old and full-day care, part-day preschool and Strong Beginnings for prekindergarten.

•**Sante Fe Child Development Center:** Offers full-day care for children 6 weeks to 5 years. Before and after care is available for prekindergarten children. Before care is 5:30 a.m.-8:30 a.m. and after care is 3-6:30 p.m.

•**Main Post Child Development**

Center: Offer full-day care for children 6 weeks to 5 years old.

•**1st Division Child Development Center:** Offer full-day care and hourly care for children 6-weeks to 5 years old. Hourly care is provided on a first come, first served basis. Reservations can be made two weeks in advance by calling 706-545-6656. Hourly care is tailored to meet the needs of those who require care not to exceed 20 hours per week.

CDC hours are 5:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. weekdays and 7 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. on training holidays.

household's total Family income or if the child will be removed from care during the furlough days, will receive a 20 percent discount off current monthly fees for each child," Williams

said. Parents who take their children out of day care on furlough days should bring a furlough letter to Parent Central Services' office, she said.

Those with children in on-post schools will be able to use some day care services at an hourly rate. But if you are not able to afford child care, you will be referred to the Army Community Service's financial readiness program, she said.

To take advantage of the CYSS options, registration is required and children must be registered at CYSS. Because of the limited availability of spaces open at the day care, Williams suggests registering and reserving a space as early as possible.

Neighbors are also able to baby-sit children in government housing for no more than 10 hours a week, she said. It is considered a neighborly gesture, and is another option to get through the furlough period.

Volunteering benefits, supports everyone involved

Soldiers and Family members seeking new opportunities can lend a hand in their communities through a variety of volunteer services.

Army Volunteer Corps connects with several organizations on Fort Benning and surrounding communities year round to find those eager to help, Army Volunteer Corps Coordinator Starla De Saussure said. Fort Benning currently has a total of 2,214 registered volunteers on post, including 1,061 Family members, 1,022 service members, 131 civilians and 408 private organization volunteers.

"Volunteering is especially important to the community because without volunteers, many organizations or services would not exist," De Saussure said. "Here on Fort Benning alone, Child, Youth & School Services would not be able to provide coaches for baseball, cheerleading, football, soccer, track and wrestling."

To spread the word about these programs, Army Volunteer Corps hosts two semiannual volunteer fairs and participates in two volunteer fairs with the Community Spouses Club and Columbus State University, she said.

Soldiers can volunteer to earn the Military Outstanding Service Medal and promotion points (E-4 and E-5). Spouses can volunteer to network, learn new skills,

review old skills, add experience to resumes or keep resumes current by volunteering between jobs.

"My goal is for volunteering to be win-win for everyone involved, the Soldier and the organization for which he or she volunteers," De Saussure said.

Children and teens can also find many academic and social benefits from volunteering.

"Teens can volunteer for community service for middle school and high school, which help enhance college applications," she said. "I encourage everyone to volunteer in a particular area of interest, especially before they commit to starting or continuing their education or career pursuits to see if that is the path they want to continue."

Programs that rely heavily on volunteers include Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts of America, Santa's Castle, Community Spouses Club, Family Readiness Groups, American Red Cross, International Wives Club, Fort Benning Wounded Warrior Association, Wounded Warrior Horsemanship Program, Soldier and Family Association, Army Family Team Building, Army Family Action Plan and the Army Volunteer Corps.

Soldiers and spouses. Habitat for Humanity and House of Heroes seem to be a favorite for Soldiers who like to build things."

De Saussure said an upcoming volunteer opportunity will be with the Adopt-a-Grandparent Program. The program will help to create more Family-friendly opportunities while providing support to older residents.

"This program will focus on Soldiers and Families 'adopting' a grandparent with priority being veterans, widows or widowers and visiting these individuals, especially during the times when the nursing homes and assisted living facilities are not being inundated with visitors, such as Mother's Day, Father's Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas," she said. "Seniors love interacting with children and vets love interacting with younger vets and telling their war stories. The effect this will have on these seniors will be priceless."

De Saussure said volunteers are recognized quarterly during the Maneuver Center of Excellence Breakfast in volunteer of the month and a volunteer of the quarter categories. The annual MCoE Volunteer Recognition Ceremony is held in April or May and formally recognizes volunteers who are nominated with 500 adult hours and 300 youth hours.

the pharmacy, phlebotomy and radiology departments will be located near the entrance."

Families are a major component of the care plan at the new hospital, Fortune said. They play a significant role in the healing process and to a patient's well-being. To help keep patients and loved ones together, surgical rooms will have a Family zone, allowing Family members to remain with a patient throughout the visit.

"Inclusion of the Family zone is a major shift in the patient-visitor dynamic," Fortune said. "Family members will be able to stay comfortably in a patient's room and not have to leave because of the end of visiting hours, nor sleep uncomfortably in a bedside chair. It will be a tremendous comfort to both the patient and Family."

In addition to a completely different layout, the new hospital will incorporate best practices from private sector and clinical research health care facility designs to enhance patient experience.

Evidence-based design elements include access to natural light and outside views.

"The new building will have many windows throughout both wings, as well as the central multilevel atrium," Fortune said.

"Visitors and staff will be able to view the natural landscape of the Fort

Benning community and healing gardens from different locations in the building. Multiple healing gardens also offer serene locations outside of the hospital to walk or sit for some quiet time while briefly escaping the events inside."

The modern hospital also combines evidence-based design elements with leadership in energy and environmental design energy saving requirements.

Natural light will fill the building through many windows, while reducing energy consumption.

A reduction of heating and cooling requirements stems from the use of rooftop gardens, energy-efficient windows and increased insulation.

Potable water needs for surrounding vegetation will be reduced by employing a rainwater collection system, drip irrigation and a sprinkler system.

"The new facility is designed to achieve LEED Silver certification," Fortune said. "The energy savings, as well as the corresponding cost savings, for a hospital the size of the future (hospital) will be significant."

"I am very excited for this new facility to open next year and very proud to be part of this project," Lamb said. "The new (hospital) will be one of the finest medical facilities in the U.S. Army. The construction demonstrates the U.S. Army Medical Command's commitment to provide the best medical care possible to the men and women in uniform, and those stationed at Fort Benning. In doing so, we are building your medical future."

No matter your goals, Hillary Bailey recommends starting early and not overloading yourself with classes. And if you don't know where to begin, start with ACES.

"Some (Soldiers) are intimidated because they don't really know what to do or how to get started," she said. "Some may not have great computer skills ... they can do all of this great Army stuff but they may be intimidated by trying to do something online on their own. A lot of them worry about their schedules — because a lot of times they might have to stay late when they are not expecting to, or they go out in the field — so they are worried about how can they complete a class when they don't always know what their schedules are going to be like."

She said although they often see younger Soldiers, there are many times when older Soldiers come to ACES especially if they are about to transition out of the military.

They realize they should take advantage of benefits such as tuition assistance before they retire or ETS, Hillary Bailey said.

"Everybody has to start somewhere," she said.

Sgt. 1st Class James Bailey, Hillary Bailey's husband, is a medical platoon sergeant who also works 10 hours or more a day. He started his education career in 1995 before online classes. Although he said he prefers the traditional classroom, he said he sees the importance of online classes.

"The main thing is having the convenience of online courses," he said. "I can do those at home, on the weekends, whenever — it's at my leisure at that point."

Once you are enrolled in a college, Bailey advises starting with one class.

"It sounds really easy when you are looking at the syllabus ... but if you try to load up on two or three classes and then get overwhelmed, get burned out — and end up having to pay money back," she said. "You'll get a bad taste in your mouth and think 'forget it, school is not for me.'"

Bad grades can affect tuition assistance, she said. And if you feel like you are struggling, talk to someone who can help you get to the root of the problem.

Only later when you get more comfortable should you take on additional classes if you think you can handle it, Bailey said.

Staff Sgt. Michael Walk is currently taking three classes at Austen Peay State University.

His goal is to get a bachelor's degree in homeland security and he also works 10 to 14-hour days as the senior processing NCO at A Company, 30th Adjutant General Battalion (Reception). He has been following his education goals since 2007 and has an associate's degree in liberal arts. He is currently going through the Army Career and Alumni Program to transition to a civilian.

"Mostly I was scared that I would fail class or I wouldn't have time due to the mission," he said about when he first started pursuing his education. Soon after he started school he deployed for the first time. "The chain of command was really supportive of (Soldiers') education."

Walk will be out of the Army in December, which is also the time when he will graduate with his bachelor's degree.

"Education can really help in the military as well," Hillary Bailey said. "If they are going to stay in and make a career, it's going to help them with promotion points. The Army is getting more competitive with the downsizing and it's important because they look at that."

Because of online classes James Bailey was able to finish his associate's degree while in Iraq, he said. But it wasn't always easy because of time.

"You are working six days out of the week. They give you a little bit of off-time on a Sunday," he said.

Currently, he said is seeking a bachelor's degree in emergency disaster management from the University of Maryland.

Realize there are many resources available to you, he said.

Walk said it's up to the individual to see what those benefits are. And on-post resources will be able to help you.

"Most of us that work here are either Family members of Soldiers or prior military or have worked with them for a very long time," Hillary Bailey said. "(We) can understand what they are going through."

"I think whenever I first came in, at one point it was a lot easier to take classes because I had less responsibility," he said. "But the more responsibility you end up getting, obviously, the more time you end up devoting to do other things."

He said staying goal-oriented will help you stay on track.

"It's like Nike, you pretty much have to 'just do it,'" Walk said.

"It helps maintain our strong esprit de corps, especially during these challenging





Consumer Ed

Dear Consumer Ed:

I took my car to a mechanic for repairs. I chose the business based on an advertisement in a local magazine, which stated that there was a six-month warranty on all engine jobs. The car cost over \$2,200 to repair.

After I had the car for three weeks, it broke down. Now the shop states that they will fix it, but I will be charged for labor. Do I have any recourse in this situation?

A: It depends on what the advertisement in the magazine actually stated about the warranty, and what terms were in your service agreement with the mechanic. If the warranty only covered parts, then you would still have to pay for labor.

If the warranty covered parts and labor or just labor, then you shouldn't have to pay for labor, and might have a breach of contract claim against the mechanic.

Even if you don't have a clear breach of

contract claim (for example, you didn't have a written service agreement, or the warranty terms in the agreement were ambiguous as to what was covered), you could still have a valid legal claim if the mechanic promised a warranty on labor in the advertisement.

If the advertisement about the warranty didn't clearly say what it would cover, the mechanic may have engaged in an unfair and deceptive business practice, which is prohibited by Georgia's Fair Business Practice Act.

In keeping with the FBPA, all advertisements should be in plain language, truthful and accurate, and free of express or implied claims that misrepresent or are otherwise deceptive.

Additionally, any necessary qualifying information must be clearly and conspicuously disclosed in the ad.

If you believe that the ad for the warranty was deceptive, you can submit a complaint to the Governor's Office of Consumer Protection

by calling 404-651-8600, or visiting our interactive website at www.consumer.ga.gov.

Dear Consumer Ed:

The house we rent was foreclosed on and then sold by the bank. There are still six months left on the lease and the new owners want to raise the rent and get a new security deposit — even though our original deposit was not returned.

Is this legal? If not, whom should I contact to resolve the issue?

A: The Protecting Tenants at Foreclosure Act, a federal law, specifically addresses your issue.

The PTFA was signed into law on May 20, 2009, and protects tenants when the property they rent is sold at a foreclosure sale. The Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act extended the PTFA protections until Dec. 31, 2014.

Even though the PTFA is a federal law, it still applies to state court eviction proceedings.

If you originally entered into your lease before the notice of foreclosure, then the new owners bought the property subject to your rights as a tenant.

In other words, your lease did not end when the property was sold at foreclosure, and the new owners must recognize your original lease. If the new owners will not use the house as their primary residence, then they must allow you to stay in the house and pay rent until the end of your original lease.

However, the new owners only have to give you 90 days' notice to vacate the property if they are in fact going to occupy the house. You would still have 90 days to vacate, even if there were less than 90 days remaining on your lease.

While you remain in the house (either for the remainder of your lease or for the 90 days), the new owners cannot raise your rent or require a new security deposit.

You will still have to pay rent, but you will pay the same rent required under your original lease to the new owners of the house.

If you don't pay rent, the new owners can go to court to have you evicted; they can also have you evicted if you stay in the house after your lease expires or after the 90 days' notice period.

If the new owners continue to insist that you pay additional rent or an additional security deposit, you should contact an attorney to address your specific case.

The State Bar of Georgia (404-527-8700 or 800-334-6865) can give you information to help you locate an attorney, or you could contact your local Georgia Legal Services Program office by visiting www.glsp.org.

You may also pursue an issue with your landlord on your own through the local magistrate court.

In the event you cannot afford an attorney, you may want to contact an organization that deals with landlord-tenant disputes, like Atlanta Legal Aid at www.atlantalegalaid.org.







Philip Whittington needed just one to go down.



Olympian Nunn to walk 50K at World Championships

DES MOINES, Iowa — Army Reserve's John Nunn used his runner-up finish in the 20-kilometer race walk at the 2013 USA Outdoor Track and Field Championships as a tune-up for the 50-kilometer race walk at the 2013 IAAF World Championships, scheduled for Aug. 10-18 in Moscow.

Nunn, 35, a two-time Olympian with the U.S. Army World Class Athlete Program, finished second behind New York Athletic Club's Tim Seaman (1:30:13.06) in the 20K walk with a time of 1 hour, 31 minutes, 1.64 seconds at Drake Stadium, June 23. Patrick Stroupe of the Kansas City Smoke was third in 1:31:08.73.

The 20K race walk at the national championships was delayed more than four hours by thunderstorms in Des Moines.

There are many parts of golf to love

It is a skill unto itself — using specialized techniques and talents, some of which are set apart from those required for the rest of golf.

This miniature part of golf, which brings a conclusion to every hole, has been castigated by some — “Golf would be a great game if it weren't for putting,” — and praised by others — “Putting is the great equalizer in a game that otherwise would be dominated by the strong and the mechanical.”

In the realm of golf, how important is putting? Putting is a vital part of the score and therefore, most certainly, a vital part of the game.

If you don't putt well, you don't play well. According to a recent study, putting accounts for 43 percent of all shots golfers play. Even that may be conservative, but if putting is half the game, my question is to golfers who are wanting to lower their scores: Are you spending half your practice time on the putting green? Is it that putting seems so simple that

practice is considered unnecessary?

Putting seems simple. It's rolling a small ball into a larger round hole. It always ends in success.

The mechanics, physical motion and mental strength required for putting is vastly different from what's required for every other swing. Realizing that there are so many personal preferences when it comes to equipment, grip, set up, stroke and special thoughts, it's easy to see why there is so much frustration.

Here is checklist to help you improve your putting:

- Brush up on basics — grip pressure, (don't squeeze the putter too tightly, you create tension in your hands and forearms), posture (set up comfortably and let your arms hang naturally; try to keep your eyes over the ball to help see the line).
- Shoulders parallel to target line — since you are using your arms and shoulders to swing the putter, double check your alignment by placing a club on the ground outside the target line and work on setting your shoulders parallel to where you want the ball to go.
- Keep the left elbow (for right handed players) tight on longer putts, and practice holding your finish until the ball stops rolling.
- Improve your touch and feel by



practicing three-foot putts looking at the hole and not the ball; or take it one step further and practice putting three footers with your eyes closed.

- Negative thoughts — step back and laugh. Be positive, will the ball into the hole.

Knowing where to aim, considering the slope of the green, the speed of the green and the grain are all information you must gather. Follow these steps to help sort things out:

- Determine the pure downhill direction of the green (most greens are built low in the front and higher in the back).
- Stand behind the hole and verify in your mind the direction.
- Factor three times the visual break to account for the actual break of the putt.
- The faster the green, the more putts break.
- The grain direction is the direction the grass grows toward the setting sun; check the cup to see where the uneven edge is.
- Players can become as “ball bound” in putting as in the full swing. Remember the stroke is through the ball, not to it.
- Focusing on a spot an inch or two in front of the ball on the target line helps to start the ball on that line and hitting through the ball.
- Even perfectly stroked putts don't always go in, due to a poor read, a poor aim or poor green.

“I've actually been training all year for the 50K, just trying to get distance,” Nunn said. Nunn picked up the pace and walked to second place in a race that served, for him, as an upscale training event.

“I'll always come do the 20K (at national championships), and I've just learned you just never know what's going to happen,” Nunn said. “Just get in the race and see. Enough people made dumb choices about going out too hard. We had a four-hour, 15-minute thunderstorm delay, and that affected people differently.”

“It was just a situation I jumped on and ended up passing the second-place guy with 150 meters to go in the race — just blew by him — and was able to pull out second place, which was great. It was a fun race and it turned out to be a good time for me.”

Nunn won the 20K race walk at the 2010 U.S. National Championships in Des Moines, and finished second in the 20K at the 2011 U.S. National Championships in Eugene, Ore. At the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, Nunn finished 26th in the 20-kilometer race walk. In 2012, he finished 43rd in the 50-kilometer race walk with a personal-best time of 4:03:28 at the London Olympic Games.

Nunn will compete Aug. 14 in the 50-kilometer race walk at the World Championships in Moscow.

“I have no clue what will happen in Moscow,” he said. “The weather can definitely play some factors with regards to the heat and mugginess that rolls through Moscow in the summer. That can really affect the 50K. We'll just have to wait and see.”

Nunn plans to return and train for the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, where he could become a three-time Olympian.

“WCAP said they will welcome me back, so I should be back next year with the primary focus on 50K,” Nunn said. “But I will still do 20Ks because, clearly, I can still place in the shorter, so it's more fun.”

Magazine, MLB honors military veterans with 'Tribute for Heroes'

INDIANAPOLIS — Injured Army veteran Jeffrey Mittman and 29 other military veterans were honored Tuesday during Major League Baseball's All-Star Game held at Citi Field in Queens, N.Y., home of the New York Mets.

Mittman and the other finalists were chosen by People magazine and MLB in their joint “Tribute for Heroes” campaign. Each finalist was selected after receiving the highest number of votes among other veterans representing their chosen MLB teams. Mittman will represent the Pittsburgh Pirates.

“Right on the heels of the Fourth of July, I couldn't be more honored to be recognized amongst such a distinguished group of patriots — at a game of baseball no less,” Mittman said. “You can't get more American than that.”

“My first memory of baseball is watching Pittsburgh in the '79 World Series, so my connection to the Pirates began very early.”

The heroes participated in the All-Star pre-game ceremony and All-Star Week festivities. One of the “Tribute for Heroes” winners will be featured in People magazine.

A roadside bomb left Mittman nearly blind and with severe injuries while he was serving as an U.S. Army advisor to the Iraqi Ministry of the Interior on July 7, 2005. Mittman, who was driving a team of soldiers in a Humvee that came under attack from unseen assailants, sustained the brunt of the explosion. He was left without a nose, lips, most of his teeth and the majority of his vision. After enduring more than 40 operations, Mittman's face was reconstructed and he successfully adapted to life with limited vision. After retiring

from the Army in 2011, Mittman worked for the National Industries for the Blind before joining the Defense Finance and Accounting Service as a public affairs specialist.

“There's no one I can think of that exemplifies an American hero and deserves recognition more than Jeff,” said Aaron Gillison, the director at DFAS Indianapolis and Executive Champion for the DFAS Hire A Hero Program.

“His attitude and uplifting message of perseverance and continuing service despite incredible adversity has inspired not only his co-workers, but thousands of others who have been lucky enough to hear his story.”

Mittman is a nationally sought-after public speaker and regularly

advocates on behalf of disabled Americans and veterans. He received three Bronze Star medals, the Purple Heart and numerous other awards for combat actions during his nearly 22-year military career.

Joe Kapaczewski represented Fort Benning and the 75th Ranger Regiment at the tribute. The Boston Red Sox was the team Kapaczewski represented.

Kapaczewski, who is from Upatoi, Ga., was the first Army Ranger to return to combat after an amputation. He lost his leg in 2005 to a grenade explosion while deployed to Iraq.

He went through 42 surgeries on his leg before the amputation. He returned to duty with a prosthetic leg and has deployed five times as an amputee.







WALKING ON THE WILD SIDE

Get away from technology, get outdoors

I left my cellphone, which is not a smartphone, at the house the other day and felt detached, like there was a piece of me missing, all day. It sometimes seems as though technology rules every waking moment of our lives — our work time, personal time, family time and even our exercise and vacation time when we should be unwinding from the stress of everyday life. People like me who believe they had chosen a profession that allowed them to spend time in the outdoors find themselves tied to technology and



stuck indoors too much.

Spending time outdoors encompasses a smaller portion of most people's lives than ever in human history. There is a multitude of research that clearly shows the dramatic decline that has occurred, particularly with respect to our children.

Most folks are aware this phenomenon is occurring and have probably seen other articles or news programs addressing these issues and the impacts reduced outdoor activity is having on our health, knowledge and well-being.

Plan a weekend camping trip. Make a commitment to take the family fishing several times a month. Introduce your children, and yourself if necessary, to hunting or shooting sports. If you just can't see yourself as a hunter, spend time in the outdoors

observing wildlife and taking pictures. You can even do so in your backyard if you just don't feel comfortable out in the woods.

There are amazing things to see and do in the natural environments that surround us. We can all learn and observe new things. Additionally, there are a multitude of documented health benefits from spending time outdoors.

All of that to say this: Find and create opportunities to spend time in the outdoors with your family. The natural wonder provided by Mother Nature and spending time in the great outdoors is invaluable. It provides a chance for us to decompress and creates opportunities for physical exertion while refining observational skills, concentration, and cognition.

Time spent in the outdoors also etches memories, such as a 4-year-old digging worms so she can go fishing — and catching, all by herself, her first largemouth bass — or trying, unsuccessfully, to roost her first turkey; chasing ghost crabs at night on the beach; catching lightning bugs; her first trip to the deer woods; catching box turtles; and on and on and on. The 76ers were irate that a foul was called on the last play of the game, which was even reviewed on tape. A new league rule was implemented this year that allows officials to review the last play of the game or the last play of the first half.

The officials upheld the call and Whittington stepped to the line.

The first circled around the rim, but fell out. The second was too strong off the back rim.

"I just kept saying, 'I just have to make one of them,'" said Whittington, who finished with 14 points.

The third took a bounce on the front of the rim, took a second soft bounce off the back and fell in, giving Fort Benning the 63-62 win and a shot at the league championship. The Heat defeated the Fort Benning Warriors in the first round of the playoffs Saturday 75-42 and will play Columbus for the title at 8 p.m. Thursday.

It was a dramatic finish that capped a Fort Benning second-half comeback against the team that eliminated the Heat in last year's playoffs.

The 76ers, behind the hot hand of Ronnie Battle, jumped out to an 11-0 lead and led by as many as 15 in the first half.

Battle finished with 27 points for the game and shot 8-for-10 from behind the arc. But when it appeared as if the 76ers would put the game out of reach early, the Heat came up with two consecutive turnovers and turned each into 3-pointers, cutting the deficit to nine points.

Fort Benning stole five points in the last 12 seconds of the half — Donald Wing hit a 3-pointer, Norman King came up with a steal on the ensuing inbound pass and Tim Elder made a field goal as time ran out. The Heat trailed just 34-27

at halftime.

"(The inbounder) didn't see me and I just stepped in front of him," King said about the last two plays of the half. "That was a five point swing. It made a big difference."

Fort Benning switched from a zone to man-to-man coverage in the second half and the 3-pointers started falling the other way.

"We had to come together as a team and that's what we did," Whittington said. "We kept playing defense, started hitting our 3-pointers; we started rebounding and pushing the ball. It all came together in the second half."

"We weren't getting out on their open man and that was killing us. We played man-to-man the entire year. We had to go back to what got us here."

What Battle did to Fort Benning in the first half, King did to the 76ers in the second. The Heat gained its first lead in the game, 43-42, after King knocked down three consecutive 3-pointers, each about five feet from behind the arc.

"(My teammates) gave me the shots," King said. "When I'm feeling it, I'm feeling it. I'm more comfortable way back (behind the line). This game, I was feeling it. Tonight was my night."

"We knew our jumper was going to fall soon. We've got three shooters and at any given time, one of us can get on. We just kept playing."

The Heat held a 61-58 lead with under 30 seconds remaining, but a blown assignment allowed for a wide open lay up, and the 76ers scored a game-tying basket with a put-back after a missed three with five seconds remaining before Whittington ran the length of the court and got off his 3-point attempt.

King scored no points in the first half but lit the 76ers up for 15 in the second. Michael Smart scored 13 points in the paint for the Heat.

Freshmen roll into 2013 football season

WEST POINT, N.Y. — Army head football coach Rich Ellerson welcomed the newest members of the Army football program July 1 as the Academy's Class of 2017 reported to West Point for Reception Day.

Of the 47 new Black Knights that began their West Point experience Monday, 14 are directly from the high school ranks, while 33 played football at the U.S. Military Academy Prep School in 2012.

Nearly half of the states are represented by the Class of 2017. Army's 47 plebes hail from a total of 23 states, including one each from Alaska and Hawaii. California is the most represented state among the group with seven newcomers, followed by Texas (six) and New York (five). Arizona (two), Connecticut (two), Illinois (two), Ohio (three), Oregon (two), Pennsylvania (three) and Wisconsin (two).

The incoming players are split almost equally between offense and defense. Twenty-four players are slated for the defensive side of the ball, 21 are currently assigned to the offense and two players are listed as specialists. The offensive and defensive lines were the most recruited areas with 10 players currently listed as members of the offensive front and nine among the defensive down linemen.

The Black Knights begin their 124th season at Michie Stadium Aug. 30 versus Morgan State.



the end zone or upper level at a discounted rate. Individual game tickets for the Morgan State game are priced at \$30, while the contests versus Wake Forest and Western Kentucky are \$35 each. Admission to the Stanford and Eastern Michigan games is \$39 per ticket.

The Black Knights return seven starters from last season's offense that led the nation in rushing. Army set school records for rushing yards (4,438),

rushing yards per game (369.8), total offense (5,235) and first downs (283). Senior RB Raymond Maples is back and will attempt to become Army's first three-time 1,000-yard rusher since Mike Mayweather (1988-90). Defensively, Army returns seven starters, including leading tackler Geoffery Bacon (136). Juniors Robert Kough and Richard Glover are back in uniform after combining for 17 tackles for loss in 2012.





The Springer is embarking on the biggest season in Columbus theater history. Not only will the new Dorothy W. McClure Theatre open in October with the Springer Children's Theatre production of *Pinkalicious: The Musical* Oct. 2-13, but the 2013-14 season is going to be the most amazing season ever in the Greater Chattahoochee Valley area.

The State Theatre of Georgia's 2013-14 season will be the most startling, exciting, thrilling, entertaining ... and, dare we say ... expensive theater season produced by the Springer or any theater in the area.

Certainly, the show that has caused the most buzz and driven a dramatic spike in season tickets sales is *Les Misérables*. - Next up will be the Oct. 2 openings of *Pinkalicious: The Musical* and the Dorothy W. McClure Theatre on 1st Avenue, right behind the Springer and next door to Foley Hall, the multi-purpose room that has served as the Springer's second stage for the Springer Children's Theatre and for the Studio II series for the last 15 years.

- Second in the Mainstage Series production is *Rave On! The Buddy Holly Experience*. This show will feature the McGuigan brothers, who wowed Columbus audiences with *Yesterday and Today: The Beatles Interactive Experience* this past March. The McGuigan brothers became musicians when their father was stationed at Fort Benning. Every Friday and Saturday night three of the brothers and their dad each played guitar and honed their musical skills.

- *California Dreaming* will play Nov. 14-23 in McClure Theatre, the first show in the Studio II Series. *California Dreaming* is an



original musical journey through the West Coast music scene of the mid-1960s and early '70s. Featuring the music of the Beach Boys; Crosby, Stills and Nash; The Mamas and the Papas and the Fifth Dimension. This will be the musical's world premiere.

- Just as in years past, the holiday season will feature two shows. On the Mainstage will be *A Christmas Carol: The Musical* Dec. 5-22. Charles Dickens' tale of tight-fisted Ebenezer Scrooge and his Christmas Eve transformation will be told with lavish singing and dancing. The Studio II Series in McClure Theatre will feature the longest running play in Columbus history — *A Tuna Christmas*. It runs Dec. 12-24.

- *A Raisin in the Sun* will run Jan. 23-Feb. 1. *A Raisin in the Sun* changed American theater forever, bringing to the stage ideas and dreams that had never appeared on Broadway before. 


