

Westover AFB

Westover AFB is the nation's largest Air Force Reserve base, and is home to the Air Force's largest cargo aircraft, the C-5 Galaxy. More than 2,700 military and civilian workers are assigned to Westover's 439th Airlift Wing, a unit of the Air Force Reserve Command. The mission of the wing is to provide worldwide air movement of troops, supplies, equipment and medical patients. The 337th Airlift Squadron is the wing's flying unit, and operates the C-5. The C-5 specializes in missions involving outsized and oversized cargo that no other aircraft can carry.



Fort Devens

Effective May 2007, the Devens Reserve Forces Training Area was renamed to Fort Devens. Following its Base Realignment and Closure in 1995, portions of the former Fort Devens were turned over to the State for redevelopment as a planned business community. Fort Devens currently operates under the US Army Installation Management Command, and is a subordinate installation of Fort Dix. Fort Devens provides training facilities and training support to enhance the readiness of reserve component units in the New England Area.



Massachusetts Military Reservation (MMR)

MMR consists of five military commands training for missions at home and overseas, conducting airborne search and rescue missions and intelligence command and control. MMR encompasses 22,000 acres. Camp Edwards comprises 15,000 of those acres, the major training area for Army National Guard soldiers in the Northeast. The Guard's primary mission is to prepare soldiers for combat missions overseas as well as missions to serve and protect the homeland stateside. The 102nd Intelligence Wing operates out of Otis Air National Guard Base. The Intelligence Wing provides world-wide precision intelligence, command and control, along with trained and experienced Airmen for expeditionary combat support and homeland security. The Cape Cod Air Force Station (ASCC) is the only land based radar site providing missile warning for the eastern coast of the United States and southern Canada against intercontinental and sea-launched ballistic missiles. ASCC is the only Coast Guard Aviation facility in the northeast responsible for the waters from New Jersey to the Canadian border. Additionally, the Coast Guard manages all airfield operations for the joint use.



Hanscom AFB

Hanscom Air Force Base and the 66th Air Base Group (ABG) – the base's host group – provides worldwide support for the Electronic Systems Center and outstanding quality-of-life opportunities for military personnel, their family members and the civilian workforce. The 66th ABG provides a myriad of services and support to more than 3,000 active duty, Reserve and National Guard military personnel and DoD civilians who work and live at the Base. Additionally, the 66 ABG supports more than 100,000 retired military personnel, annuitants and spouses living in the six-state New England area.



Natick Soldier Systems Center

The US Army Soldier Systems Center (SSC), located in Natick, Massachusetts, is the Army's one-stop Soldier-support organization. Employee/tenant numbers total approximately 2,000 military/civilian personnel and government contractors. SSC is responsible for researching, developing, fielding, and managing food, clothing, shelters, airdrop systems, and Soldier support items. The four tenant units at Natick include: the Natick Soldier Research Development and Engineering Center, the US Army Institute of Environmental Medicine; Program Manager Field Sustainment; and the Integrated Logistics Support Center.



U.S. Army Corps of Engineers - New England District (NED)

Located in Concord, NED is responsible for managing the Corps' civil works and military programs in a 66,000-square-mile region that encompasses six New England states. NED employs about 500 civilian employees and military officers. NED has many varied missions, which include environmental restoration and stewardship, flood damage reduction, navigation improvements and maintenance, disaster assistance, regulatory programs, engineering and construction management support to other agencies, and support to the military.
