Sustainability and the DoD Mission



CAMP GRAYLING

Camp Grayling is Michigan's premier military training area. Its 147,000 acres supports year round training for the National Guard; Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force and Coast Guard active duty and reserve units; international military units; and over 100 law enforcement agencies. It offers a unique combination of training facilities including small arms, artillery, mortar, and aerial gunnery and bombing ranges; urban assault ranges; a convoy commanders reaction course; unit maneuver areas; and two 5,000-foot runways capable of landing C-130 and C-17 aircraft. It provides over 200 full time jobs to local residents and is home to over 600 soldiers of the Michigan Army National Guard.

DETROIT DISTRICT, U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS

Originally established in 1841, the Detroit District investigates, plans, designs, constructs, operates and maintains Congressionally authorized navigation, flood control, beach erosion and other related projects. The District covers an area of 82,000 square miles of land including 4,000 miles of Great Lakes shoreline and the world famous Soo Locks. It also manages the Great Lakes Water Control Data System, making it the Corps of Engineer's center for hydrometeorologic and water level data collection and dissemination for the Great Lakes system.

ARMED FORCES RESERVE UNITS

Michigan is home to a wide variety of Army, Navy and Marine Corps Reserve units located throughout the State. Major Reserve units include elements of the Army Reserve's 88th Regional Support Command; Naval Reserve Support Centers in Grand Rapids, Saginaw, Lansing, Detroit, and Battle Creek; and elements of the 1st Battalion, 24th Marines.

MICHIGAN ARMY NATIONAL GUARD

The Michigan Army National Guard plays a vital role in support of the State during emergencies and to the Nation in support of military deployments around the world. Truly a state-wide organization, the Guard operates out of dozens of armories located throughout the State. Its major organizations include the Joint Forces Headquarters in Lansing, the 63rd Troop Command in Wyoming, the 46th Military Police Command in Lansing, the 272nd Regional Support Group in Jackson and the 177th Military Police Brigade in Taylor. The National Guard operates major training areas at Camp Grayling and Fort Custer.



DETROIT ARSENAL

Formerly the Detroit Army Tank Plant, Detroit Arsenal is now home to the U.S. Army Tank-automotive and Armaments Command (TACOM). TACOM is one of the Army's largest weapon systems research, development, and sustainment organizations. Its primary mission is to develop, acquire, field, and sustain soldier and ground systems for the war fighter through the integration of effective and timely acquisition, logistics, and cutting-edge technology. It has a staff of approximately 400 military and 5,700 civilian personnel.



MICHIGAN AIR FORCE NATIONAL GUARD

An important component of the Michigan National Guard, the Air Force National Guard actively fulfills its dual missions to support the State in times of emergency and to provide the U.S. Air Force with combat ready personnel and equipment during time of war or national emergency. Its major organizations and facilities include: the 110th Air Lift Wing at Battle

Creek, the 127th Wing at Selfridge Air National Guard Base and the Alpena Combat Readiness Training Center.
