DoD and military service representatives work proactively with State legislators and officials to build partnerships and awareness of actions that could benefit or impact the military mission.



JOINT BASE – MCGUIRE, DIX, LAKEHURST (JB-MDL)

The Base Realignment and Closure Act 2005 directed the merger of installation support functions for New Jersey's Fort Dix and Naval Air Engineering Station Lakehurst to McGuire Air Force Base. Located 18 miles southeast of Trenton, N.J., the 42,000-contiguous acres of JB-MDL are home to more than 42,000 Airmen, Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, Coast Guardsmen, civilians, and their family members. The 87th Air Base Wing provides installation management support for 3,933 facilities with an approximate value of \$9.3 billion in physical infrastructure. JB-MDL also houses the U.S. Army Reserves, the 99th Regional Support Command, and the Naval Air Systems Command.



PICATINNY ARSENAL

Picatinny Arsenal is a joint service armament research and development center. There is no other comprehensive armaments facility like it in the country. Picatinny is a one-of-a-kind facility that provides virtually all of the lethal mechanisms used in Army weapon systems and those of the other military services. Situated on a 6,500-acre military installation located in the northern New Jersey, Picatinny is the pre-eminent national and international leader in the research, development, engineering, and production support of advanced weapons systems.



NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS (NJ DMVA)

The New Jersey Army National Guard (ARNG) is governed through the NJ DMVA. Maintaining 64 armories, a nine-acre training center in Sea Girt, New Jersey, and a presence in 42 communities, the ARNG consists of over 9,000 Guardsmen from New Jersey. Also governed through the NJ DMVA, the New Jersey Air National Guard (ANG) maintains the 108th Air Refueling Wing, a unit responsible for aerial refueling. They fly the KC-135R Stratotanker, based out of McGuire Air Force Base. The ANG 177th Fighter Wing is stationed at Atlantic City International Airport and is made up primarily of F-16C/D aircraft.



NAVAL WEAPONS STATION EARLE (NWS)

Naval Weapons Station Earle is located approximately 47 miles south of New York City, in Colts Neck Township, Monmouth County, New Jersey. NWS Earle's Waterfront site, which has the finest pier on the East Coast, is located on Sandy Hook Bay adjacent to the town of Leonardo. Their 2.9 mile pier, the only one of its type in the United States, is outfitted with excellent rail and truck accommodations. NWS Earle provides Fleet operational services and infrastructure management to support Combat Logistics Force home-porting, ordnance functions, and tenant activities in execution of the National Military Strategy.
