DoD And State Partnerships


DoD and military service representatives work proactively with State legislators and officials to build partnerships and awareness of actions that could benefit or impact the military mission.



DoD IN NEW YORK

Fort Drum

Located in New York's picturesque North Country, Fort Drum is the Home of the U.S. Army's 10th Mountain Division (Light Infantry). It has a population of 18,463 Active Duty military personnel and 17,409 family members. Major Units within the 10th Mountain Division are the 1st Brigade Combat Team, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 4th Brigade Combat Team, the Combat Aviation Brigade, and the 10th Sustainment Brigade. The civilian workforce totals 4,693 employees. Fort Drum encompasses 107,652 acres (168 sq. mi.) and is the largest employer in Northern New York.

NEW YORK ARMY NATIONAL GUARD (NY ARNG)

Under the New York Division of Military and Naval Affairs headquartered in Latham, the NY ARNG organizes, trains, and equips New York's citizen-soldiers to endure quick mobilization within the State or world-wide. The NY ARNG has multiple activity locations within the State to include numerous armories, operational maintenance shops, and training locations on active Army bases. Camp Smith is maintained solely by the NY ARNG in Cortlandt Manor near Peekskill, New York, about 30



miles north of New York City. Camp Smith's 1,900 acres contains a number of training assets, such as maneuver areas, outdoor ranges and simulators that are available to military units, law enforcement agencies, government and civilian organizations.



WATERVLIET ARSENAL (WVA)

WVA is home to a one-stop manufacturing process that is unparalleled anywhere in the defense industry. Located in Watervliet, New York, it is the Nation's premier cannon manufacturer and a premier strength for the Army in producing its weaponry. WVA takes great pride in being one of the few remaining government-owned and operated manufacturing centers in the Department of Defense. In addition to the more than 600 Department of the Army

Civilians, who are directly tied to the manufacturing of mortar tubes, tank cannons, and artillery barrels, there are another 275 personnel who work in the Army's Benét Laboratories, which is collocated on the Arsenal.

U.S. Military Academy, West Point Garrison

Located 50 miles from New York City in the scenic Hudson River Valley of Orange County, the U.S. Military Academy at West Point is a four-year academic institution and a nationally-renowned historic site. As the world's premier leader development institution, West Point accomplishes its mission by developing cadets intellectually, physically, militarily, ethically, spiritually, and socially. The student body, or Corps of Cadets, numbers 4,400. West Point is also home to 1,324 Active Duty soldiers and 2,797 family members. Supporting the mission of the Academy is a civilian workforce of 3,090 personnel.



FORT HAMILTON

Located in Brooklyn, New York, Fort Hamilton houses a Military Entrance Processing Station, Reserve Units, Ainsworth Clinic, and the New York City Recruiting Battalion. Fort Hamilton is home to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers North Atlantic Division, one of eight regional business centers that deliver projects and services to the Armed Forces. Established in 1825 and named in honor of Alexander Hamilton, the first Secretary of Treasury, the post has several notable commanders including Captain Robert E. Lee, First Lieutenant Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson, and Captain Abner Doubleday. The main mission of Fort Hamilton is to provide metropolitan New York with military installation support for the United States Army Reserves and Army National Guard.
