Did You Know In OHIO

- DoD employs 8,261 Active Duty, 28,523 Reserve and National Guard and 25,001 civilian personnel with an annual payroll of over \$3.8 billion.
- DoD's annual budget adds more than \$10.25 billion to the Ohio economy.
- Huffman Prairie Flying Field, located adjacent to the Wright-Patterson Air Force Base main runway, is the site of the world's first operational airfield and is where the Wright-Brothers, in their own words, "really learned to fly."
- The Ohio National Guard constructed and manages four solar energy fields covering nearly 11 acres that will save the state approximately 1,933,000 kilowatt hours of energy each year.

JOINT SYSTEMS MANUFACTURING CENTER – LIMA

Joint Systems Manufacturing Center (JSMC) – Lima (formerly the Lima Army Tank Plant) provides the United States Military with a premier industrial facility capable of manufacturing, repairing, refurbishing, and testing the full spectrum of combat vehicles and defense systems used by the U.S. Armed Services. JSMC is a government-owned contractor-operated

facility operated by General Dynamics Land Systems. Current vehicle programs include the Abrams tank, Expeditionary Fighting Vehicle, Future Combat Systems, Mk46 weapon station and Stryker.


WRIGHT-PATTERSON AIR FORCE BASE

Wright-Patterson Air Force Base (AFB) is one of the Air Force's largest, most diverse and organizationally complex installations. With a highly specialized workforce of over 27,000 military, civilian and contractor employees, Wright-Patterson is where America's Air Force aircraft of tomorrow are conceived, developed, and acquired. Missions include acquisition and logistics management, research and development, advanced education, heavy airlift flight operations, intelligence, and others. Major organizations include Air Force Materiel Command, Aeronautical Systems Center, Air Force Research Laboratory, Air Force Security Assistance Center, National Air & Space Intelligence Center, Air Force Institute of Technology, the 445th Airlift Wing and the 88th Air Base Wing.



U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS - GREAT LAKES AND OHIO RIVER DIVISION

The Great Lakes and Ohio River Division is headquartered in Cincinnati and operates as a regional business center overseeing the work of seven Corps of Engineer districts covering 335,000 miles and 17 states within the Great Lakes and Ohio River watersheds. The Division's civil works missions provide engineering products and services supporting navigation, flood and storm damage reduction, ecosystem restoration, emergency response, recreation, hydropower, water supply and regulatory permits. Their military missions provide engineering, real estate expertise, and design and construction management for the Army, Air Force and other Department of Defense agencies.

OHIO ARMY NATIONAL GUARD

Headquartered in Columbus, the Ohio Army National Guard consists of over 11,400 soldiers located at 52 Readiness Centers and 23 Logistical Facilities in 38 counties across the State. It includes 5 major commands: 37th Infantry Brigade Combat Team, 16th Engineer Brigade, 174th Air Defense Artillery Brigade and Joint Task Force 73 all headquartered in the Columbus area, and the 371st Sustainment Brigade in Kettering. The Guard maintains several training

facilities including Camp Perry and the Camp Ravenna Joint Military Training Center. The Guard plays a vital role in support of the State and the Nation in time of crisis including military deployments around the world.

ARMED FORCES RESERVE UNITS

Ohio is home to numerous Army, Navy, Air Force and Marine Corps reserve units. These units provide trained, equipped, and ready military personnel as a vital part of the Nation's Armed Services. Reserve units are located throughout the State and work alongside Active and National Guard Units to support domestic and international military missions. Major Ohio reserve units include: 3rd Battalion, 25th Marines; Navy Operational Support Centers in Youngstown, Columbus, Cincinnati, and Toledo; Air Force 445th Airlift Wing at Wright-Patterson AFB and 910th Airlift Wing in Youngstown; numerous units of the Army's 88th Regional Support Command; and others.



OHIO AIR FORCE NATIONAL GUARD

Headquartered in Columbus, the Ohio Air Force National Guard is comprised of over 5,000 men and women. Major flying wings include, 121st Air Refueling Wing in Columbus, 178th Fighter Wing located in Springfield, 179th Airlift Wing in Mansfield and 180th Fighter Wing located in Swanton. Ohio Air National Guard maintains and operates a variety of aircraft including the F-16 Fighting Falcon, C-130 Hercules, and the KC-135 Stratotanker. The Air National Guard plays a vital role in support of the State in times of emergency and has played a major role in support of National military deployments around the world.
