Mr. Bryan Gossage was sworn in as the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Installations, Energy and Environment on May 18, 2020. He is the principal deputy advisor to the Secretary of the Army and Chief of Staff of the Army on all matters related to Installation policy, oversight and the coordination of energy security and management. He is also responsible for policy and oversight of sustainability and environmental initiatives; resource management including design, military construction, operations and maintenance; Base Realignment And Closure (BRAC); privatization of Army family housing, lodging, real estate, utilities; and the Army's Installation Safety and Occupational Health (SOH) programs.

Prior to his appointment, Mr. Gossage served the State of North Carolina from 2013 through 2019 in various roles including: Deputy Secretary of the Department of Commerce, Director of the Division of Land and Water Stewardship, Executive Director of the Clean Water Management Trust Fund, and Strategic Operations Advisor for the Administrative Office of the Courts. Of note, Mr. Gossage led initiatives with senior military and civilian leadership to establish and provide oversight on readiness and environmental protection projects to relieve current or anticipated environmental restrictions on military testing, training, or operations for the Naval Facilities Command (NAVFAC), the Army Installation Management Command (IMCOM), and Marine Corps Installations (MCI).

Additionally, Mr. Gossage served as a councilman in Apex, North Carolina from 2003-2009 and as Mayor Pro Tem from 2009 to 2011.

Mr. Gossage currently serves as a Medical Service Corps Officer in the U.S. Army Reserve. His awards include the Army Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal, the North Carolina Commendation Medal, and the National Defense Service Medal. Mr. Gossage completed both his undergraduate degree, and a graduate-level fellowship focusing on Public Administration, with California State University. He is also an Eagle Scout.
