David H. Dentino, a member of the Senior Executive Service, is the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Installations, Housing and Partnerships where he develops and oversees Army-wide policies, programming guidance and strategies for a host of critical installation programs and services for Soldiers, Families, and Civilians, including but not limited to: Military Construction, Facilities Sustainment, Restoration and Modernization, Real Property Asset Management, Owned and Privatized Housing, Real Estate and Installation Planning and Management.



Mr. Dentino graduated from the University of Texas and began his service with the Air Force in 1989. He has a wide variety of engineering, environmental, and construction experience. He has held positions at Director of Public Works (DPW), group, major command, and field operating agency levels. Prior to his current assignment, Mr. Dentino served as the Deputy Director of Civil Engineers, Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics, Engineering and Force Protection, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C. He was responsible for supporting the Director of Civil Engineers by providing executive leadership, direction and technical knowledge for installation support functions at a total of 176 Air Force bases worldwide with an annual budget over \$8 billion. He was also responsible for organizing, training and equipping the 51,000-person engineering force along with providing policy and oversight for the planning, development, construction, maintenance, utilities and environmental quality of Air Force bases worldwide valued at more than \$420 billion.

Mr. Dentino has also served as an SES in multiple positions at the Air Force Installation and Mission Support Center. As the inaugural Director, Installation Support Directorate, he was responsible for providing resourcing and guidance to Air Force units worldwide in the fields of installation engineering, communications, force protection, emergency management, air and ground transportation logistics, chaplain programs, and morale, welfare and recreation programs. Additionally, he served as the Executive Director of the Air Force Civil Engineer Center, where he assisted the Commander in leading 2,200 people, directly overseeing the execution of over \$11.8 billion in contracts across all Public Works responsibilities worldwide. The missions included facility investment planning, design and construction, operations support, real property management, energy assurance, environmental compliance and restoration, and readiness and emergency management.
